The objective of these puzzles is to make a specific shape, made of only an outline or silhouette, using all seven pieces, but they can't overlap. They were brought over to Europe in the 19th century by trading ships. It became very popular there. Tangrams were brought to America by Captain M. Donaldson in 1816. Copies were then made and sold.

Lego® History

In 1932 Ole Kirk Christiansen sets up a business. In 1934 the company and its products took on the name Lego, which is from the Danish words "LEg GODt" meaning play well. In 1947 the Lego company buys a plastic injection-molding machine of making toys (which was the first in Denmark). In the year 1962, Legos were introduced to the United States in sets of loose bricks. By 1966 Lego kits were guiding people to make planes, ships, trucks, building, and more. Lego gained more fans when they added the 1969 Duplo line for younger children and with the 1977 Technic line for teens and older kids. In 1998, Lego started the Lego Scala Planet specially designed for girls (using regular building materials with a family of dolls and other things.
